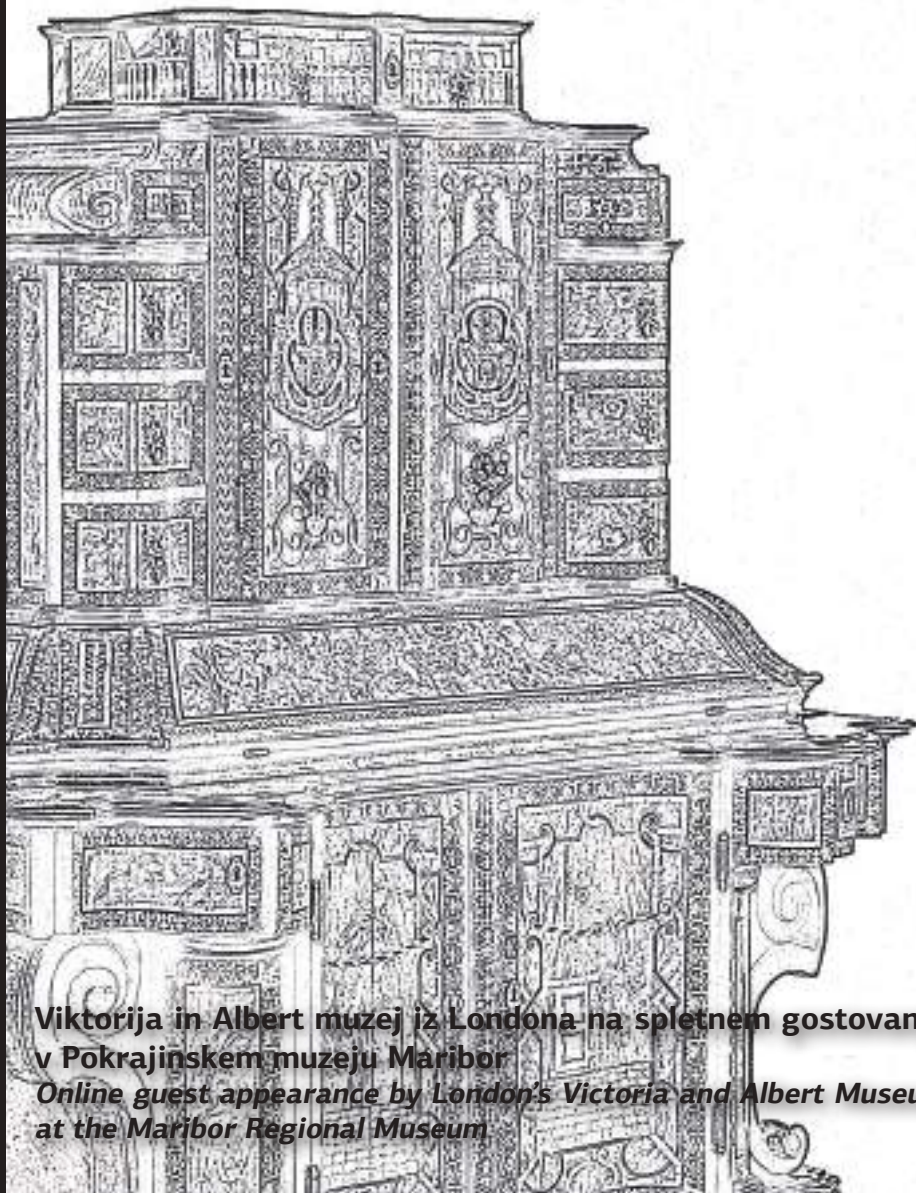

Reminiscence preteklosti evropskega izročila temeljijo na ukani, ugrabitvi in posilstvu, ki ga je »zakrivilo« poželenje grških bogov. Srednjeveška Evropa nas popelje v svet viteštva, udvornosti in razvoja omike, poljuba miru, vdanosti in ljubezni ter nenazadnje vere in upanja. Renesnančna Evropa izhaja iz lepote duha in čutnosti, razsvetljenstvo iz razuma, doba meščanstva in moderna doba pa iz idealov enakosti, svobode in solidarnosti.

Projekt **museoeurope** se simbolično naslanja na renesančni rek o »učenosti, ki oživlja, kar umira,« in »umetnosti, ki kliče nazaj na svetlobo, kar je potonilo v senco«. Gre za izmenjavno idej in izkustev, znanja in dediščine, ki razkrivajo različne obraze Evrope. V okviru projekta smo sodelovali z različnimi muzeji, kot so: Univesalmuseum Joanneum iz Gradca, Guardia Svizzera Pontificia iz Vatikana, Bayerisches Nationalmuseum iz Münchna, Muzeum Narodowe w Warszawie iz Varšave, Muzeul Țăranului Român iz Bukarešte, Zemaljski muzej Bosne i Hercegovine, Muzej Sarajeva, Bošnjački institut – Fondacija Adila Zulfikarpašića iz Sarajeva, Liszt Ferenc Emlék Múzeum És Kutatóközpont iz Budimpešte, Landesmuseum Burgenland iz Eisenstadta, muzej Alimentarium iz švicarskega mesta Vevey in Gradski muzej Varaždin. V letu 2021 smo k spletnemu sodelovanju povabili Viktorija in Albert muzej iz Londona.

The reminiscences of the European heritage are based on cunning, abduction and rape, "committed" by the desire of Greek gods. Medieval Europe takes us into the world of knighthood, courtliness and the development of manners, the kiss of peace, devotion and love and after all faith and hope. Renaissance Europe originates from the beauty of the spirit and sensuality, the Enlightenment from reason, the time of the Bourgeoisie and the Modern Age from the ideals of equality, freedom and solidarity.

*The project **museoeurope** symbolically refers to the Renaissance saying about "knowledge, that revives what is dying", and "art, which brings back into light, what has descended into darkness". It is dedicated to the exchange of ideas and experiences, knowledge and heritage, which unfolds the different faces of Europe. Within the frame of the project The Regional Museum Maribor collaborated with The Universalmuseum Joanneum from Graz, The Pontifical Swiss Guard from Vatican, The Bavarian National Museum from Munich, The National Museum in Warsaw, The National Museum of Romanian Peasant from Bucharest, The National Museum of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Sarajevo Museum and The Bosniac Institute – Adil Zulfikarpašić Foundation from Sarajevo, The Liszt Ferenc Memorial Museum and Research Centre from Budapest, The Regional Museum Burgenland from Eisenstadt, the Museum Alimentarium from Vevey Switzerland and The Varaždin City Museum. In the year 2021 we have invited The Victoria and Albert Museum on virtual exhibition.*

**OMARA GALLUSA JACOBA, WÜRZBURG, 1716,
IZ ZBIRKE POHIŠTVA V VIKTORIJA IN ALBERT
MUZEJU IZ LONDONA (INV. ŠT. W.23-1975)**

Razkošna omara je bila izdelana leta 1716 v knežjem mestu Würzburg. Okrasje priča, da je bila narejena za Johannesga Gallusa Jacoba, kasneje imenovanega Gallus Jacob von Hohlach (1670–1736/7), izjemno vplivnega finančnega ministra würzburškega knezoškofa Johanna Philippa von Greffenclau zu Vollraths (1652–1719). Gallus Jacob si je v prvi polovici 18. stoletja pridobil tudi veliko osebno premoženje. Ambicioznost naročnika je botrovala razkošni rabi tako domačih kot tropskih vrst lesa, tudi bogato oblikovanega kačjega lesa, uporabljenega za ozadje intarzirane monograma naročnika na zgornjem delu omare. Bogati rjavo rdeči in svetlo zlati odtenki lesa so kontrast okrasju iz želvovine, roževine in kositra.

Omara pa ni zanimiva le zaradi svojega imenitnega porekla, zelo zanimiv je še en vidik. Za božič leta 1967 sta se namreč fantiča iz družine tedanjih lastnikov igrala in raziskovala omaro. Ko sta odstranila enega od notranjih predalov, sta našli na nepritrjen kos lesa, pod njim pa je bilo pismo iz leta 1716. Dokument potrjuje, da so omaro naredili v delavnici dvornega izdelovalca omar Servatiusa Arenda (1673–1729), v njem pa sta navedeni tudi imeni mojstrskih pomočnikov, ki sta omaro dejansko izdelala. To sta bila Jacob Arend, Servatiusov brat, in Johannes Wittalm.

Pismo prinaša obilo informacij tako o omari kot o družbenih okoliščinah tistega časa. Jacob Arend je napisal: »Omaro sem zasnoval sam, narisal sem jo in začrtal ... (Intarzije) sem izdelal z rezbarsko žago in jih osenčil.« Očitno je bil silno ponosen na bogate intarzije, ki so odražale vse njune veščine v tem materialu, vključno s cvetlično, arhitekturno, živalsko in drugo ornamentiko – kar bi se komu utegnilo zdeti že kar pretirano obilje.

Najzanimivejši je zapis na drugi strani pisma, kjer je opisano vsakodnevno življenje pomočnikov v letu, »ko sta bila zelje in grah običajno najboljša hrana, ki sva jo lahko dobila«. Z razmerami nista bila zadovoljna in v želji po boljšem življenju sta si Würzburg želela zapustiti. Razlog za to je bila po njunih besedah »velika madžarsko-turška vojna«. Pismo, ki je bilo skrito več kot 250 let, zelo zgovorno priča o težavah, s katerimi so se morali soočiti celo cenjeni obrtniki, ki so si služili kruh v tistih nemirnih časih.

**THE CABINET OF GALLUS JACOB, WÜRZBURG,
1716, FROM THE FURNITURE COLLECTION OF
THE VICTORIA AND ALBERT MUSEUM IN LON-
DON (INV. NO. W.23-1975)**

This elaborate cabinet was made in the princely city of Würzburg in 1716. The decoration identifies it as having been made for Johannes Gallus Jacob, later Gallus Jacob von Hohlach (1670-1736/7), who was the all-powerful finance minister to the Prince Bishop of Würzburg, Johann Philipp von Greffenclau zu Vollraths (1652-1719). Gallus Jacob was also extremely successful in creating a personal fortune in the early eighteenth century.

The ambition of the patron explains the cabinet's luxurious use of both native woods and tropical timbers, including richly figured snakewood as the ground to the inlay of the patron's cypher inside the desk. The rich reddish browns and light golds of the woods are contrasted with details in turtle-shell, horn and pewter. Despite its grand provenance, there is another aspect of the cabinet that makes it of unique interest. In 1967, two small boys from the family that then owned it were playing during a family Christmas party. When they removed one internal drawer they found a loose block of wood and under this a letter dated 1716. It not only recorded that the cabinet had been made in the workshop of the court cabinet-maker Servatius Arend (1673-1729) but also provided the names of the journeymen-craftsmen who had actually worked on it: Jacob Arend, the brother of Servatius, and Johannes Wittalm.

Their letter is full of information, both about the cabinet and about the social conditions of the time. Jacob Arend wrote 'I have designed this cabinet on my own, and have drawn and marked it out.... I have cut [the marquetry] with a fret-saw and have shaded it'. He was clearly immensely proud of the ambitious marquetry that showed every aspect of their skill in this medium, including flowers, architecture, animals and formal ornament – perhaps in what we might think a rather unsophisticated profusion. Most interesting of all is the record on the other side of the piece of paper, of the daily life of the pair in the year 'when cabbage and peas were often the best food we could obtain'. They were dissatisfied with their conditions and seeking to leave Würzburg in search of better fortune. The cause, as they recorded was 'a great war in Hungary against the Turks'.

Their letter, hidden for more than 250 years, speaks to us with extraordinary power, of the difficulties of even fine craftsmen in making a living at a time of turmoil.

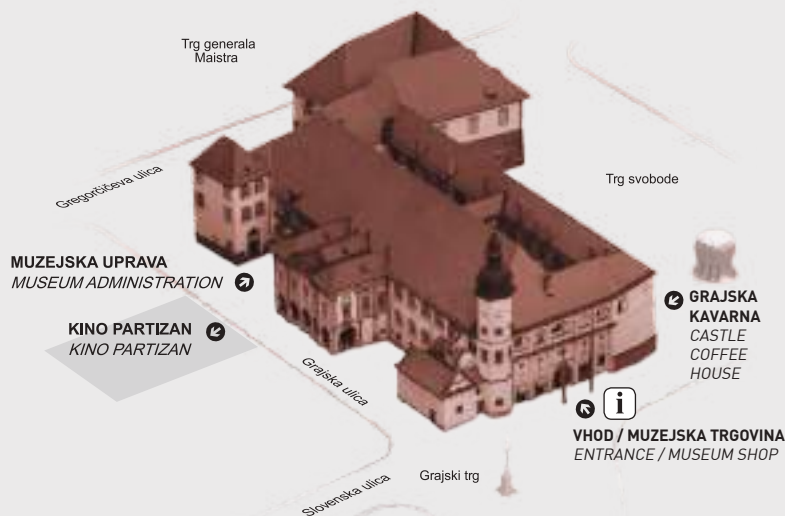
